

In July 2016 twenty-five photographers from around the Bay Area were invited to document the interior of three buildings at The Point, the first major redevelopment project within the former Naval Air Station. The artists who were granted this unique access were attracted to the project because of a shared appreciation for industrial architecture and urban exploration. This display is the opportunity to see their work, creatively documenting these spaces through twenty different lenses.

Building 66, located at the corner of W. Atlantic and Ferry Point was constructed in 1942 and served as an engine maintenance facility. Building 398, located along W. Atlantic Ave is the youngest of the trio dating back to 1957 and was used as an air turbine maintenance facility. Finally, Building 67 with its distinctive three roll up doors and train tracks running through the building was originally used for locomotive and later auto repair. This building will be renovated as part of the development at The Point.

When complete The Point (Site A) will be a 68-acre mixed use project including 800 units of housing, 600,000 sq. feet of commercial and retail space, and 15 acres of new park space at Alameda Point.
